Editorial Jan 2015

A special thanks to Lyn Towell for catering our Friday Christmas party. As usual it was a stunning affair with ham off the bone, smoked salmon and pate de foie gras, followed by copious amounts of champagne, beer and some softies. During the feast we were joined by Pauline Saliba and managed to present Pauline with flowers and a small gift in appreciation for the use of the field in 2014.

Keeping with the timeline, the Sunday Christmas party was held in conjunction with a scramble and a SAMs vintage challenge. We had 9 starters in the scramble and the standard was fairly high considering that the weather was almost perfect. Died peacefully on the 28 of December 2014







Report on the Free Flight Scramble 14 Dec 2014


