Editorial May 2015

We also had a meeting at the Royal Hotel with CL and RC to work on the next Nationals at West Wyalong on our field.

Bulletin number 1 is not yet available but will be shortly. We have contacted the Bland Shire Council and they will provide every support that they can manage. The inactive airport has been booked, Redman oval has been booked and other venues will be made available as required. On a sadder note Ivor F died recently and his funeral was held at Pinegrove Cemetery, Minchinbury on 28 Apr 2015. I was present for the service and the wake which followed at the Rooty Hill RSL. It was a sad day but Ivor was sent off in style. Many people talked of Ivor's exploits and his contribution to the hobby (now a sport). I can remember Ivor in his (and my) earlier days when I was only 12 years old. The club at Doonside throbbed with enthusiastic seniors and juniors, meetings were regular and frequent and sale of balsa, fuel and engines was constant. I miss those days now and I will miss them even more with the loss of Ivor.

I will look forward to seeing you at the next meeting. Remember that free flighters keep it up longer.

Eulogy for Ivor F formerly Ivor Francis Stowe

10th June 1915 - 19th April 2015

Ivor Francis Stowe was the first born to Beverly and Harry Stowe of Birmingham England on the 10th June 1925. Apparently it was a long and painful labour a fact not overlooked by either mother or child. The family migrate to Australia in 1927 settling in Doonside.

Ivor is a "sickly" child and suffers from rheumatic fever and kidney stones by the age of 5. His parents are devout followers of the Christadelphian faith and host the local ecclesia in a room in their Cross St home. Over the next decade Ivor is joined by a brother Ronald (deceased) and two sisters Dorothy and Frances.

Doonside at this time is a largely rural area and Ivor's domain is the Doonside creek and the "pump hole" where he builds and paddles tin canoes fashioned from galvanized sheet and packing case ends. At about this time he is given a Women's Weekly Cabin model (a small rubber powered model aeroplane) and this triggers a life long obsession with aeromodelling.

He is enrolled at Parramatta High along with Arthur Cooper and it is here that he meets Vera.

Although his parents are conscientious objectors, after completing his matriculation and with the war in the Pacific ramping up, Ivor tries to enlist in the RAAF in 1943. He is rejected because of his childhood medical history but finds no such prejudice in the Army.

The first his mother knows of this is when she sees him in uniform on D'side railway station.

Whilst undergoing training he is involved in the recapture of escaping Japanese POW's at Cowra and on completion of his training is then deployed to Borneo in 1945. He steps off a boat on his 20th birthday on Labuan and is saved from being shot when his captain (Greville Lushington) bayonettes a sniper who has already killed 2 of the company.

A three month stint in Japan as a medical orderly follows the Japanese surrender and eventually he is demobilized in June 1947.

At sometime during 1948 Ivor and others form the Doonside Aeromodellers Club.

In 1948 Ivor enrolls in Teachers College and studies to be a Physical Education instructor. He woos and marries Vera in 1949. (she didn't know what she was in for) and builds a house on a 5 acre block halfway between Doonside and Blacktown. Two children follow, Sand in 1950 and Tahn (Me) in 1952.

Ivor attends Sydney Uni part time and completes a BA in 1955 but also reapplies to the RAAF. He is offered appointment as a Pilot Officer in the Permanent Air Force but does not take up the commission.

Instead he becomes an English / History teacher, teaching at Granville Technical School, West-mead and Blacktown Boys High. His relationship with the Dept of Education is "difficult", telling me at some stage that his file had been annotated in large letters "never to be promoted". During this period he and Vera become very involved with the Blacktown Swimming Pool Committee which is raising money to build a 50 metre public swimming pool.

Also during the 60's Ivor quits smoking and the Doonside Blacktown Aeronautical Technicians Society (as they had become) who meet twice a week build a 34' x 18' club house at the rear of the Kildare Rd property. Ivor attends and competes in nearly every National Championship (more than 50 in total) and hundreds of kids and adults are exposed to model aircraft and aeromodelling through his various programs. A record unlikely to be equaled.

Believing his only chance of promotion is to retrain as a school counsellor, he completes an MA in psychology and agrees to do country service in the far west of NSW at schools such as Wentworth, Hay and Booligal. This is followed by a western Sydney appointment and he eventually becomes a District Guidance Officer.

He collaborates with well known model engine manufacturer Gordon Burford to produce the Doonside Mills in the early 70's the first of a couple of such projects.

Also at this time he decides to publicise spelling reform (SR1) by changing his name by Deed Poll to Ivor F.

This period sees him run in the first of his 42 City to Surfs and to put himself up for election at both state and federal elections, becoming Australia's "most unsuccessful" candidate.

The ABC crowns him their bicentennial "eccentric" in 1988. He is a serial contributor to the SMH Column 8, a cryptic crossword addict, "annoys the mouth organ", a reciter of poetry and collector of model aeroplane magazines and engines.

Ivor was always passionate about any cause he adopted and was first to put his money where his mouth was. Such causes as buying a flying field at Pitt Town (the only modeller owned field in the Sydney basin), establishing state school scholarships for meritorious / disadvantaged kids, which he funded by working after retirement, and the production of 500 control line models to teach kids to fly, are but a few examples.

No doubt there are many here today who were inspired by his enthusiasm and energy, his spring was tightly wound, and the world is a better place for his having been here.

WW Southern Cross Cup - 2015

The AFFS at Narrandera was pretty much a wash and wind out but we did get one good day of flying.

Wednesday was a day of travel for all and the trip was a mighty 90 minutes on the road north on the Newell.

The Southern Cross Cup started at 8.00am on Thursday 23 Apr at West Wyalong. In contrast to the previous week the weather was sensational. The first two rounds were shortened to 45 minutes because the weather was so good. The models were going nowhere and often seen overhead. The contest ran seven rounds but only one max out. This was surprising as the weather was so good and the lift hung around ready for all to see. It seems that silly mistakes and a feeling of 'she'll be okay' penetrated the field. In the end Paul Rossiter of WA fame got the seven straight maxes. I have not included the scores; in that weather and conditions, the others do not deserved to be mentioned.

F1C and A for day two but with the weather man giving us a warning about winds in the afternoon we shortened the contest to five rounds with a fly off the next day. Overall the weather was good for the first five rounds but the wind direction and speed for the afternoon made things a bit difficult. Two flyers from A and the three from C managed to max out.

Saturday 7.30am and all on the field ready to fly. We were situated on the southern boundary with the wind relatively gentle and headed towards the house about 1.5 km away. The whistle blew and first away was Terry Bond. The wind immediately turned 90 degrees and the other two models followed while the A flyers looked on, had a giggle, and started to move to a safe location.

Terry First, Roy second and Gary third, but Terry and Roy a long way away off the paddock and out of sight at 8 and 6 minutes respectively. Both models took some time to find because of distance and trees but both were located. By the time the C boys were on their way back the A team had completed their flights and were back having a cup of tea. At this stage the weather broke and both C team members were drenched in a thunder storm. A recovery party was organised with Peter Braid, Matt Hannaford, Gary Goodwin and the two wet wonders. This included ladders, poles and ropes tied to both four wheel drive vehicles.

We met Chris Bush at the gate looking a bit worn from the night before and he gave us some strange directions which sent us into some soft earth but we back tracked and had another go through another property. On the way we met a local, Jim Black who was only too helpful and allowed us to travel across his land. He was working his land in a monster tractor preparing for his winter crop. We recovered the models fairly easily with ladder and sticks and unpaid labour. A special thanks for the help. Even Jim came over and had a look at the models.

Back to the homestead then off home after a cuppa and a shower. Matt and Gary stayed over and had a bbq that night, I am sure that there was enough reward left in the fridge to console them.

Unfortunately Tahn Stowe who had organised the SCC was not able to participate. His father had passed away some days before and he returned to Sydney prior to the event. Thanks again Tahn for the work arranging the SCC.
