

HISTORY OF R/C MODELLING IN AUSTRALIA

Radio control has been around since Nikola Tesla demonstrated a remote control submarine in 1898. World War II saw increased development in radio control technology. The Luftwaffe used controllable winged bombs for targeting Allied ships. During the 1930s the Good brothers Bill and Walt (USA) pioneered vacuum tube based control units for R/C hobby use. Their "Guff" radio controlled plane is on display at the National Aerospace museum. Ed Lorenze published a design in Model Airplane News that was built by many hobbyists.

Ross Hull (1902 – 1938) was an Australian radio pioneer who worked mainly in the USA. In the modelling world he was a radio control pioneer credited in 1938 for having invented the rubber driven escapement. In 1936 and 1937 he flew the world's first successful R/C sailplane, mainly as a slope soarer. Sadly he was electrocuted in 1938 working on an early TV broadcasting system.



Tesla R/C submarine 1898


Dr Bowen of the CSIRO used radio controlled gliders released from high altitude balloons to gather atmospheric data and samples and return them safely to North Head Sydney in the 1950's. These looked more like V1 Buzz bombs with rectangular aluminium covered wings and tailplanes, than our modern high aspect ratio gliders.

The first radio control contest ever held at an Australian Nationals (1950) was won by Jack Hearn of Hearn's Hobbies fame. Here in NSW one of the first R/C contests held was at an MFC meeting and was won by Bob Young.

John Marquette started Advance Hobbies in 1958 and subsequently started producing R/C equipment under the Silvertone label. John produced single channel superregen valve equipment to begin with and later went on to produce superrregen 10 channel valve reed equipment.

These were the first commercial R/C units produced in Australia. Silvertone eventually went on to produce transistorised S/C, reed and proportional systems gaining world-wide acceptance in the process. Silvertone is still in business today (Wagga) manufacturing UAVs.

Over the years there were many starters in the Australian R/C equipment manufacturing field but competition from imports was brutal and most did not last long. Panzer and PSA were probably the two strongest and longest lasting. Kraft had an assembly and service centre in Geelong which ran for many years under Barry Angus and Brian Green.

Modern reliable radio control as we know it today really began with the advent and wide spread availability of the digital proportional system in the late 1950's and early 1960's. Originally designed by Doug Spreng and Dan Mathis and sold as the Digicon system this was followed by Bonner and Hoover's F&M Digital 5 systems USA).

Silvertone in Australia produced their first digital proportional prototype system in 1965 and their first production digital system in 1966 as the Silvertone Mark III. The Silvertone digital proportional line ended with the Mark 22, the last of which was produced in 2013, almost 50 years to the day after Bob Young purchased Silvertone from John Marquette in 1963.

By 1970 reliable digital systems both imported and locally produced were freely available at very reasonable prices and thus began the modern R/C era. One of the big attractions of the Digital proportional sets was the fact that these sets come ready wired with plug in servos and rechargeable Nicad batteries. Gone were the days of tedious hand wired reed and single channel systems with the need to replace dry batteries every week.

The early digital systems were almost exclusively Pulse Position Modulation systems (PPM) but some later variations swung to Pulse Coded Modulation (PCM). The RF modulation in modern PPM and PCM sets used FM as against the early AM (Amplitutude Modulation).

The most recent systems have now moved on to Spread Spectrum or Frequency Hopping transmission on 2.4GHZ. In the opinion of this author Spread Spectrum as against Frequency Hopping being the better of the two modern systems on the grounds that the recovered recompressed Spread Spectrum signal reduces incoming noise to almost zero allowing the modulated data to be recovered from well below the noise floor, resulting in a much cleaner recovered digital signal.

Thus in the span of a single lifetime modellers have seen R/C modelling progress from the most primitive systems imaginable to systems of such profound complexity and reliability that the complexity of the modern R/C equipment is almost beyond the understanding of the average modeller. They are indeed marvels of modern technology. And this is only the beginning. What will we see in the next 50 years?
