Editorial March 2018

Hi team last meeting we discussed the constitution and approved some amendments. That is now complete and it should easily satisfy the taxation department. A long time coming but at least we now understand the requirement.

The 70th nationals administration is well and truly up and running and we now have nearly a full house on entries. Very close to 250. It should be a very busy time. Hopefully we will receive a briefing from our coordinator at the general meeting.

We are currently working on a new application for the club grant scheme which requests two 20ft shipping containers for the storage of the old MAAA museum items as well as a storage unit for lawn mowers, bikes and other machinery.

The control line pad has been laid with about 300 cubic metres of road base and rolled flat. There is a border of about 8 meters surrounding the hard stand that has been cleared and this includes a bund wall to prevent any wash away.

The synthetic grass was rolled out to settle and stretch as was the conveyor belting from the paper factory in Albury. Grass was cut edges trimmed, additional synthetic grass laid to reduce dust and increase recreation around the house, a fence moved. The front of the house was painted and it looks a gem. The RC shade shelter had fines laid underneath the shaded area and synthetic grass was laid over the fines and 3 metres to the front. It is almost palatial. You could almost play tennis on the court in front of the house.

The working bee on the weekend 8-13 Mar exhausted all participants. They were Roy Summersby, Peter Scott, Reg Towell, Robert Oomen, George Bishop, Terry Bond, and non member Jeff Bond. As usual we would have been lost without Chris Bush and his mighty Caterpillar Bobcat. Thanks fellas it was a very hard weekend and the effort you put in was amazing. A special thanks for all your efforts, I know it was a hard slog and I was exhausted on my return home, so I know how you felt.

Work has commenced on the front gate modifications but a heavier machine is required to move the old concrete and steel pipe cattle grid out of the way. The plan is to have a very recognisable set of gates with piers denoting the free flight field.

Sorry about the brevity of this editorial but time and hard work at the AB field has sort of drained the journalistic levity I try to normally provide. Remember that free flighters keep them up longer.


Nationals
