Contest Report - Sunday 7 March 2021

Your intrepid correspondent awoke at an unfamiliar (to him) hour i.e. 5 am. It took me another 45 minutes to actually arise. This was followed by a mad panic to arrive as close to 7am as possible in order to meet my commitment to be on time. I was very surprised to find only one car in the paddock when I arrived. Then the penny dropped – flying was to commence at 7 am but the contest would not start till 8 am !

By this time the day had dawned bright & clear at Richmond. Three things were on the agenda $-\frac{1}{2}$ hour Scramble, Open % and BBQ. Eventually there was a good roll up with some faces from the past (Karl Mattas, 3 generations of the Bojec family and our Old Timer friend Condo Smith) joining the Richmond diehards (President 007, Vice President Aaron, Secretary Roy, Treasurer Gary G, Andrew Linwood, Peter & Gail Scott, Bruce Hao, and yours truly).

Scramble

The ½ hour walking scramble got underway at close to the appointed hour with 8 combatants hurling their flying machines into the blue. It was a good start for all except for the Scramble World Record Holder Terry Bond whose machine suffered irreparable damage due to a mid-air collision on its first flight. The rest of the field continued with some nice (for scramble) flying taking place. I was timing for Karl Mattas who had a well -trimmed model flying fairly consistently at 60 to 80 seconds per flight. All the fliers were blessed with very still weather conditions, although the mild drift that was present did swing around a bit over the half hour. There were one or two long retrieves thanks to some models that flew far better than needed in Scramble.

At the end of the half hour the score sheets were handed in and the scores tabulated. I had high hopes for Karl as he had flown very consistently over 15 flights. However Peter Scott had quietly amassed a very good score with seven 120 second maxes and two sub max flights. Gary Goodwin had been very energetic with 16 good flights. The final results were as follows;

2021 Hunter Valley Championships Report

Over the weekend of 28th and 29th February Muswellbrook District Model Aero Sports hosted the 2021 Hunter Valley Championships. The field was looking the best it has ever been due to regular rainfall through the summer period and high humidity on many days with no extremely hot days to brown the grass off. Club members put in a lot of work leading up to and over the weekend and a big thanks must go to them for their efforts.

This year Hand Launch Glider was re introduced but due to the uncertainty of possible entry numbers it was merged with Catapult Glider and Tip Launch Glider. Contestants could enter up to two categories if they chose. This gave a total of nine entries which was pleasing for the organisers. It was obvious that catapult Glider had the decided advantage so in 2022 Catapult Glider will be an event on its own and Hand Launch Glider and Tip Launch Glider will run as a combined event.

It was so good to see Len Surtees back to aeromodelling and making the trip down to this event. Len hasn't flown much of his favourite event for many years but showed he was quickly getting his skills back. The event was run from 7am to 9am on the Sunday morning as it had to fit in with the program for other events as well.

The Catapult Glider category had five entries with Michael Towell getting into his flights early. Michael's model launched brilliantly and settled into a lovely glide. The air seemed quite buoyant helping Michael get in some good flights with one of 75 seconds. By the time the others started to put in some flights the air seemed to have cooled a little and possibly wasn't quite as buoyant. Roy Summersby had some early problems with his launch which was surprising as the day before in practice his model launched very well. Roy started to get some reasonable times towards the end of his flights. Len Surtees also had some unexpected launch issues which took a while to sort. Young Lachlan Tolmie was guided by his dad Shannon to put in his six flights and be a valued part of the event.

Hand Launch Glider also had five entries with Len Surtees and Michael Towel backing up from Catapult Launch to be in this category as well. Sadly Shannon Tolmie damaged two of his serious HLG models in practice so opted to fly a newly finished vintage HLG. Secretary of the Muswellbrook Club, Lindsay Muffett also entered with a vintage glider which was built many decades ago. Len Surtees had the upper hand here, flying a newly finished Sting 18 Mk2 which is one of his own designs. The best flights for HLG were only around 30 seconds due to the weather conditions.

There were no entries for the TIP Launch category.

Because Len entered two categories he has managed to take out two of the places. As mentioned earlier Catapult Launch will be a separate event to Hand Launch next year so get building.

A range of Control Line events were also flown and well supported with good entries with these being:

27D Goodyear which is a racing event where the model must be fitted with a diesel engine and must average at least 27 seconds over ten laps.

Vintage Team Race with only three entries this year but will most likely be run again next year.
