Editorial June 2014

Hi Team, editorial again, but this time it is good, good really good news. We now have a 701 acre paddock. It is located in West Wyalong at 1390 Clear Ridge Road. Our field is now owned by the NSWFFS and is suitable for all F1 and other events. You will read more about this in this free flighter and it is so exciting to have a home at last. This has been donated by a very generous person who wishes to remain anonymous. Please bear in mind that this is not part of the money held in store for the purchase of fields by the MAAA. You may remember that the original field purchase on the same block of land with the full DA requested by the NSWFFS was denied by the MAAA.

We now hope that our membership will increase and include all free flighters from Australia. At the recent MAAA council conference I spoke with a number of state executives and they all said that all free flighters should affiliate through the NSWFFS.

Currently we are in the process of CASA approval and discussions with the local gliding club. We do not see any of these things being a problem and we will fly our state champs there on the June long weekend. Book your motels now.

I attended the MAAA council conference last week end and can clearly say that very little affected the free flight society except that fees remained the same. Insurance is still the main reason for joining the MAAA. A marketing consulting has been engaged to try to make the MAAA more communicative and accessible to the masses. A new web page is in construction and an on line magazine is being published. A survey has been launched via the internet and members have been requested to complete the survey. A significant amount of criticism has been levelled at the executive of the MAAA and the members of the land bureau.

A recent publication produced by MAS included a copy of the recommendations completed by the 'Review committee' which examined the purchase of land for the NSWFFS. The recommendations included a paragraph that stated 'The argument to spend funds on fanciful or grandiose visions, simply because they are there to be spent, is the act of an irresponsible organisation unfit to administer the interest of a large Australia wide membership base'. I challenged the writer of this paragraph but he could not remember writing it. Despite this, MAS published this scandalous piece of literature to all of their members. I do not believe that this engenders good relations between the associations. I also believe that the executive of the MAAA would have given MAS permission to publish this document.

Our field at Richmond is still blessing and we fly there courtesy of Charlie Saliba. It is a great field for scale, P30, the minis and our social events. It is a bit small for fly off for open and F1 events and especially open rubber. Jim Christie is our rubber 'GUN' and he is chaffing at the bit to give some of the young upstarts a lesson in the art of open rubber flyoff. West Wyalong on the June long weekend should be the best lesson Jim could give to his challengers. I am really looking forward to flying against Jim because he managed a cool 5th place in P30 behind the team Hannaford junior team last weekend. I must say that I dropped a second to miss the flyoff.

A special thanks to 'Whacko" for the Poppet plan but I am not sure that I should thank WC Roy for the Hurricane 69 kit. At least the money will go to a junior.

LAND.

A Flying Field, to call our own.

After fifty years of talking and hoping it has finally happened. Yes we are now in the process of buying 701 acres in West Wyalong. This has come about by one very generous modeller who has taken over what the MAAA should have funded. It means that we modellers Australia wide, will have somewhere to fly, as long as we require it. The field is suitable for all disciplines and in time will be the envy of modeller's world wide.

The property is 1.9kms x 1.4kms, and is located at 1390 Clear Ridge Road West Wyalong. Clear Ridge Road runs off to the north from the main road near the Cameo and Country Roads motels. Once on Clear Ridge Road it is a 13kms drive on a sealed road (10min). The entrance is on the right and we will sign it. There is a homestead on the property about 1km in, this is an all weather dirt road. The house is in fair shape and could be rented to a model friendly person. The land can also be leased out for sheep farming, which will help with ongoing costs in maintaining the property. More details on this new and exciting field will no doubt be discussed at the coming meeting on Friday 30th.

We are going to hold the NSW state champs for F1 A, B & C at West Wyalong on the June long weekend 6, 7 & 8 June, please make a note of this and don't drive to Narrandera.

Just because it is an FAI competition it should not stop you from coming along and flying whatever you want. Drive time to West Wyalong from Sydney is about five and a half hours, (483kms) about an hour less than Narrandera.

Program for the competition is the same as last year.

Saturday F1B Sunday F1A & C this leaves Monday as a reserve day. Come along see the property for your self and have a fly, all welcome.
