

Editorial May 2016

Hi team, most should know the results of the control line world champs in WA recently. Our team race boys managed to get first and second in their discipline with I think a world record. Our competitors in other disciplines tried hard but did not get a guernsey. Congratulations to all.

The amalgamation of the three societies in NSW is now dead in the water. It is not a legal proposition at this time and could only be accepted if the three societies agreed to combine voluntarily. At this stage that is unlikely to occur.

An invitation to join the free flight society has been sent to all clubs within NSW. Many members of other societies have expressed a desire to join the FFS rather than stay within their current organisation. The FFS can supply all services normally required by the RC fraternity; gold wings, courses, model inspections and insurance. This is not an exclusive service and can be arranged by the FFS.

As a direct result of the effort put in by Tahn Stowe, the New South Wales Free Flight Society held the 69th MAAA Free Flight Nationals at West Wyalong 28 May-2 Jun 2016. Tahn liaised with Jeff Stien the local development officer, the high school principal and others to produce a very successful nationals.

A number of flyers from eastern states competed and put in some very creditable results. I am not sure of the total number of entries but it was close to 200. Results for the nationals will be published in this newsletter. Unfortunately the medals did not arrive in time for the presentation but those present at the dinner received a standing ovation. Medals will be mailed to place getters when received. The Chinese banquet went over a treat and all had plenty to eat and drink on the night.

At the completion of the nationals the state champs were programmed to start. Unfortunately the rain and untimely bad weather arrived in a gust so the champs have been postponed to the 16-17 Jul. This should be a bumper weekend as we have the SAMS competition on the same days. As usual we will have camping and caravanning on the field as well. The usual showering and toilet facilities will also be available.

Our next general meeting will be brought forward one week to 8 Jul 2016 (same date for the Tennant Creek Show if you are interested) to allow our members to attend the postponed state champs on the following weekend. Our next AGM will be on 16 Sep 2016 and we should start thinking about nominations for committee positions.

Fees were again set at the national conference which was attended by Roy and there is no change; \$90 for seniors and nil for juniors with an affiliated parent or guardian. Renewals for members and Friends of West Wyalong are due on 1 Jul 2016. Our next AGM will be held in Sep 2016 as is normal and it will be the last production of a paper Free Flighter. Future productions of the Free Flighter will be internet only. A shame really but the work to manage that amount of paper is becoming too difficult for our secretary.

That's about all folks; just remember that free flighters keep 'em up longer! Have a good winter and start building that very last model.

This was a sight

John Corby came out to Richmond with a genuine 1954 model and it flew beautifully, it was a real pleasure to see.

March 2016 is one of my memorable modeller's months when I ventured again to fly one of my most treasured, and my oldest, model. A 1954 winner of the 'Anthony Hordens' Wakefield trophy it was quite a decision to decide to fly this model again after 62 years. After a fair amount of replacement of the original Jap tissue which was very brittle, a reassuring inspection of the structure, and provision for a Vin Morgan tracker beacon (unheard of in '54) it was very satisfying to watch it fly as it last did in 1954.

An interesting example of Rules of the time, no limits on rubber weight, (16 strands of 1/4"), fuselage min cross section- length squared/100, retractable single leg plus twin fins for support and ROG rise off ground take-off, single blade folding propeller. This original design was very representative of the best practices of the time.

No warps evident and the model flies beautifully - as well as it did on one flight from Barton Park Rockdale, close to KS airport, across Botany Bay to land just offshore the Kurnell Oil Refinery. Fortunately seen to land in the water and retrieved by a local fisherman who was keen to make that important phone call from the 'finder of this model'

Speaking of scrambles, Chris once again preformed well in the one hour day scramble, beating all the experts, well done Chris. Full results can be found in the electronic newsletter. There were fly offs in seven events, all of these were run the next morning. The indoor made a very good social afternoon for flyers, as well as giving the locals a chance to see and meet us. We had to change the planned spit roast due to Chris Bush not being able to cater for us on the Thursday night. We improvised and had 24 sit down in the dining room and back verandah to a meal of Chinese. Over all a great Free Flight Nat's.

Fees are now due

Yes it's that time of the year again. Most join the club that they have been in for many years. That club then registers them through the NSWFFS, this system has worked quite well and of course you can still do this, just make sure that you tell your club to register you through NSWFFS.

This year there is an alternative. There is now a club called Free Flight Club of New South Wales. The fee is the same, \$90 per year, paid direct to NSWFFS. You can still join your own club and just pay their club component of the fees, in my case \$10 to Doonside. The reason behind this is that it may make us eligible for a grant of \$5000 from the MAAA. This money can be spent on equipment or improvements to our flying field which of course is the AB field at West Wyalong. At this stage we have spent the bulk of our funds some \$45,000 on improvements to the AB field, we, the current executive plan to keep our term deposit (\$9950) in place, in case of unforseen circumstances. There is still plenty that can and will be done to the property in time.

As 2016 is the tenth year of Oily Hand and as Phil is the only aeromodeller to have attended every year we have made Apex the model of the meet for 2016. The plan for the model can be downloaded from www.outerzone.co.uk or the Cowra MAC website. You can scale the plan and build Apex whatever size you like. It is also OK to make him R/C. Just make sure you stick to the engine regulations for Oily Hand.

As usual there will be a concours judging and a photo shoot at lunchtime on Saturday. Because Apex was intended as a PAA Load model we will be running a much modified load event for pilots to test their Apex and flying skills. See the included flier for rules and quidelines.

ORGANISATION

On arriving at the field you will need to register at the clubhouse before flying. MAAA cards need to be presented at registration.

Registration fee for Oily Hand is \$25, this includes entry fee for any of the events you wish to participate in and also the 2016 Oily Hand rag.

3. F/F MODELS CAN BE DIESEL, SMALL GLOW, RUBBER POWER, CO2 OR TOWLINE GLIDER.

NOTE THOUGH, THAT AFTER 2:30PM SUNDAY ONCE THE EVENT IS FINISHED ANY TYPE OF MODEL CAN BE FLOWN

YEP, THAT INCLUDES ELECTRIC TOO.

Apex PAA Load Event

The Model:

The model must be the Apex.

It need not be the same size as the original.

It must be flown as a free flight model. Any radio control system must be disabled.

Engine:

The engine can be glow or diesel. The capacity must not exceed .051cuin (.84cc) for glow engines and 1cc for diesel engines.

Payload:

This will consist of a plastic ziplock bag and sand. Both these items will be supplied on the day. Write your name on the bag with the texta. It is upto the pilot to secure the payload to the model. It is suggested it be rubber banded to the fuse under the CG.

How the event runs.

The aim is to make your Apex carry as much weight as possible.

You have between 1:30pm on Sat 27^{th} and 10:30am on Sun 28^{th} to experiment and complete the event.

Keep adding more sand to the bag till your poor old Apex just staggers around the sky. Then get your observer to time and check that the attempt is made according to the rules.


How the flight is to be made.

- 1) Each pilot must provide an observer/timekeeper for any attempt.
- 2) The model is to be loaded with the payload.
- 3) It can be hand launched.
- 4) It must remain airborne and not touch the ground for 30 seconds from the time it leaves the pilots hand for the flight to count.
- 5) The engine can run for the entire 30 seconds.
- 6) Once the flight is satisfactorily completed the model with the payload attached is to be taken *immediately* to the weigh in station.

The observer is to weigh the payload and fill in the recording sheet verifying that the flight was successful.

The payload is to be placed in the payload box for weight checking at the event end on Sunday.

7) The winner will be the pilot whose model keeps the heaviest payload aloft for the 30sec flight.


The David Owen Oily Hand Perpetual Free Flight Scramble Trophy

This year saw the passing of our great friend and regular Oily Hand day attendee, David Owen. If there was anyone who epitomised what Oily Hand is about, it was David. Aeromodelling, and model diesels in particular, were a huge part of his life. From skipping school to fly models as a youngster, through 'coincidentally' competing in the Nationals whilst honeymooning, to his regular attendance at events like OHDD, he was always a keen participant and contributor to our hobby.

David, of course, was notable for his association with model diesels in this country. He had an encyclopedic knowledge of them, and a gift for making them and working on them. For some of us, our first diesel (and many subsequent ones) came with an "Owen Engines" sticker on the box. Almost all the PAWs, MP Jets and Schlossers that we enjoy so much at Cowra were sourced through David, and there are plenty of other model diesels that are only running today because of his skills in the workshop.

While there were many aspects to aeromodelling that David enjoyed, Oily Hand was one of the highlights of the year. For him, being one of a bunch of relaxed and happy modellers out in a paddock was about as good as it got. He loved the area, the atmosphere, and the company. He didn't always manage to fly as much as many of us, because he was forever answering questions and helping out with problems, but he enjoyed that too.

In honour of David's contribution to proper aeromodelling, a perpetual trophy has been instituted. While he was active in CL and radio, David's great love in modelling was FF. He was the first winner of the OHDD FF Scramble, and it's fitting that this event will now be known as 'The David Owen Oily Hand Free Flight Scramble'. The perpetual trophy will be awarded each year to the winner. David will be in our hearts and minds as we run around the paddock chasing our aeroplanes. We will remember him, as we enjoy the pleasure of running the engines David provided and fixed for us.



West Wyalong Update 4

The matting in the back yard has been laid and pegged, this makes the house a lot freer of dust. There is still some painting required, the new doors, and lounge walls below the picture rail are still to be done. The missing bit of roof between the front verandas has been finished, making this outdoor area more user friendly in the rain. The lounge ceiling has been screwed up, and should stay in place for another forty years. It has also had two coats of paint and looks very good. We had another Emu parade around the camp area, as the rains had brought quite a bit of rubbish to the surface. I know there is more in the ground, but we will remove it as it keeps appearing. We are definitely making progress tidying the place up. We could use a lot more matting (artificial grass) if you know of any. What we have used came from a hockey field and is just what we need. We have put feelers out through the councils and the Albury paper mill (dryer screen) so if any becomes available we will be in with a chance.

Work on our program over the next few months is, pipe across road just before coming to the house, new water pressure tank on both house and amenities block, road base on the road leading to the amenities block, (very bogie after rain) removal of some large bushes and scrub to improve flight lines.

At this stage we have spent a total of about \$45,000; I believe it has been spent both well and wisely. There is about three or four thousand to be spent in the very near future but once again I will repeat the last paragraph in the last newsletter.

We know that we have spent a lot of money on improvements but our aim is to get the field used by as many people as possible. The more the field is used the more dollars there is to maintain the property and make it the best club owned field in the world.

Once again we would like to thank all those that have supplied their time and often materials to improve our unique property.
