ANNUAL REPORT TO THE NEW SOUTH WALES FREE FLIGHT SOCIETY – SEPTEMBER 2024

Our long-standing President Terry Bond, and Vice President Aaron Booth resigned at the beginning of 2024. Terry has been President for the last sixteen years and over that time has put in a huge amount of effort for the Society. Terry was a major driver in the development plans for our West Wyalong property (AB Field) and in physically implementing those plans on site. Terry's been a driving force in the administration of the Society over the entire 16 years. On top of this Terry has been a keen & exemplary competitor in the Australian Teams at World Champs in Israel, Argentina, France, Mongolia & Hungary. We could never thank him enough. Aaron in the last few years has been a big support to Terry and the NSWFFS.

Whilst we might be considered a small ordinary member of the MAAA, we are very active. I am pleased to say that we have attracted a few female members who are both building and flying their own Free Flight models. We also have a few juniors who are active but like all clubs, we would like many more.

Financially we are doing reasonably well. We try to keep approximately \$15,000 in our general account at all times for the unexpected. We maintain the annual costs on our property with normal income. Adding to this we have raised thousands of dollars through donations of modelling goods which have been sold on eBay. All these proceeds go into improvements at our property. Sadly, most of these goods have come from deceased modellers, but it is far better we have them than see them go to the tip. Recent work at the AB field has been some concrete around the house, front path making the step up easier and under the clothesline.

Activity at our normal Friday flying site at Richmond has been very good over the last twelve months. All members have done a fine job consistently observing the ground rules with the RAAF base while also complying with MAAA MOP's. At the same time, we have maintained an excellent relationship with the owner of the land which we call home every Friday Day morning. Last year we were still getting over the covid crises, but this seems to have abated and I am pleased to say our numbers on Friday flying days at Richmond have increased. The encouraging notices which Terry Bond sends out on Thursdays both reminds the members about flying and also informs them on the weather forecast for Friday. I am sure this helps to keep the members coming.

The main event for the year was the 73rd Nationals over Christmas / New Year at West Wyalong. This was a combined CLAS / NSWFFS event. Terry Bond was the main coordinator and was ably supported by Paul Turner, Peter & Gail Scott, Murray Wilson, Andrew Heath, Bob Fitzgerald and myself. Thankfully the weather was relatively mild for that time of year. Fears of very hot and windy weather turned out to be unfounded. Overall, it was reasonably well attended event and was enjoyed by all who attended

This year we ran a scale weekend at West Wyalong in October 2023, this was quite successful and we intend to run it again this year. It is NOT a competition, just a fly in. Any sort of scale-looking model is acceptable be it RC, CL or FF. If the model you bring doesn't meet the requirements, we will have a spot for you to fly, meaning it is a social weekend for all. A genuine fun fly.

For the past fifteen years or more we have run a Free Flight scale weekend at Richmond in July. This is always popular and it is normal to see twenty models on the field. This year now that covid is not so severe we hosted a couple of our brothers from across the ditch (NZ) to join us. It is always good to have them fly with us and to socialise off the paddock. For some reason we are usually blessed with super weather on these weekends. This year was not quite so good, but we certainly flew. We included control line for the first time and we will run it again next year

Some of our members attended the Maxmen competitions in the USA this year and a third place was gained in F1C (by yours truly). These competitions are the biggest in the world outside of the European and World Championships with about 25 countries in attendance. It is a bit like the "unofficial World Champs" and carries great prestige.

On a sad note, this year we lost Geoff Potter due to cancer. Geoff will be missed by all of us of us. Also, our oldest member John Coby OAM, has had to stop modelling and move to Victoria to be in care of his daughter. It is worth remembering that John was the designer of the full-size light aircraft the "Corby Starlet" and received his OMA for services to aviation.

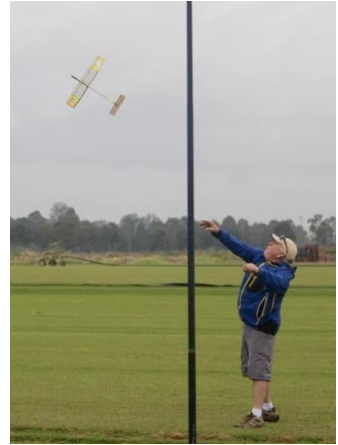

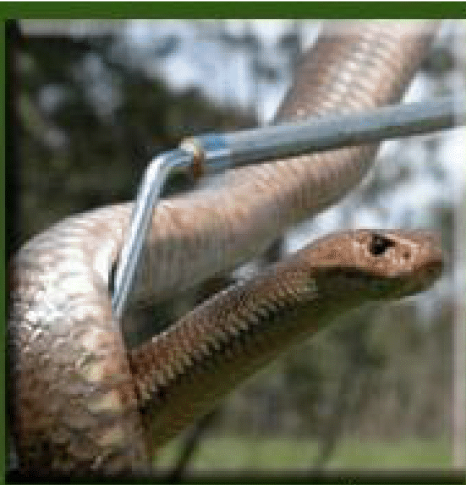

SNAKES ALIVE!

Nine Tips To Avoid Snakes

1. **Snakes don't hear noise** so if confronted by one you can alert others by sound without concern that it will increase aggression from the snake. However, *don't waive arms around or make sudden movements* which the snake could interpret as being hostile.
2. Research indicates that **90% of snake bites are to the ankle area** which is a good reason to wear gaiters. Some bites also occur to the hand so be very careful in picking things up in an area where you can't see what is on the ground.
3. If you are too close to walk around a snake and there is no escape path, **back away very slowly**.
4. Snakes don't lie in wait for people, and mostly **try to escape contact**.
5. A snake **can strike from any position** and may curl itself up slightly in preparation to strike to gain extra distance. If the snake's head is raised this may indicate that it feels threatened.
6. Snakes are **hard to identify** so don't try and catch the snake to ascertain whether they present a risk or not.
7. Step onto rather than over logs – a snake may be basking on the other side.
8. Be alert at all times when in the bush, especially in the early morning during the warmer months when snakes are more likely to be sunning themselves but are slow to react i.e. slide away from you
9. Avoid walking through long grass or reeds.

Current treatments for Australian venomous snake bites, including sea snake bites

Pressure-immobilisation is recommended for all Australian venomous snake bites, including sea snakes. This technique was developed in the 1970's by Professor Struan Sutherland. Its purpose is to retard the movement of venom from the bite site into the circulation, thus "buying time" for the patient to reach medical care. Research with snake venom has shown that very little venom reaches the blood stream if firm pressure is applied over the bitten area and the limb is immobilised. Pressure-immobilisation was initially developed to treat snakebite, but it is also applicable to bites and stings by some other venomous creatures.

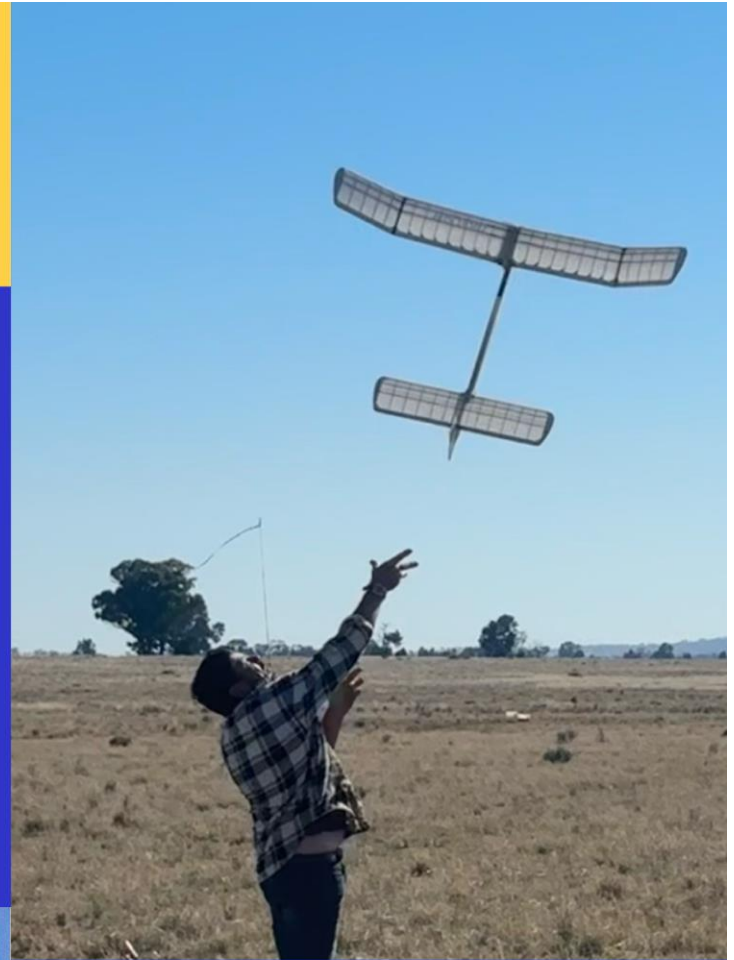
