EDITORIAL JANUARY 2011

Hi Team, the 64th Nationals in Dalby have come and gone and in a most spectacular fashion. Some people got there and some did not. I tried for three days and was challenged by some very wet conditions and flooded roads. Each time I thought I might have an edge I was thwarted by rising and fast flowing waters. I finally returned to Goondiwindi by a large detour half way to St George. I then made phone calls to other flyers to check conditions in Dalby. At that stage I heard on the radio that the water treatment plant had been closed and there were serious water restrictions in Dalby. It was then that I decided to return home.

Despite the inability of some modellers to get to Dalby, the not quite right free flight field, the nationals were a success. It is not necessarily the flying that is the essence of the Nats but the camaraderie and renewing friendships each year. I was disappointed I could not get there and felt something was missing this year.

The 65th Nats will be organised by AWA and that may take place a week after Easter 2012. This is probably the best time of the year in WA to hold a FF championship. The winner of the Doonside trophy for 2010 was won by Jim Christie for his performance with his F1G models. Jim is an exceptional rubber flyer and his F1G models are innovated and second to none. He has been published in Free Quarterly and he is happy to provide a plan on request. The Doonside trophy for 2011 will be presented for F1J when this competition is complete.

Many of our flyers will be going to Lost Hills in the USA in February this year to compete in F1 events as a lead up to the World Champs in Argentina over Easter 2011. I have no doubt that other flyers will fill the shortage each Friday at Richmond while we are away.

The Friday Christmas function on 4 December 2010 on the field was attended by Pauline Saliba and despite our strenuous efforts, would only have one glass of champagne. A large bunch of flowers and a Myers Card was presented with thanks to Pauline and Charlie in our appreciation for the use of the field for 2010.

2011 will be a very busy year for free flight. There are competitions in the USA February, Vic State champs in March, the World Champs over Easter, the AFFS and the SC Cup in June, and TT scale after that. If you were playing cricket your comment would be 'howzat!'

Try an On-Board Glow Starter

It is much easier flicking a switch on and off than putting a clip on an off a glow plug. It is also safer for the fingers.

I have done this to two all-sheet profile Biplanes, Cox Powered, 36" and 40" span very successfully.


The Sub.C. size NiCad 1.2 v with wire and switch weigh about 1.8oz. Although performance must suffer a little, it is not noticeable on these sport models. The climb and glide seem just the same as usual.

The Sub.C. NiCad is 1300MAH, weigh 1.6oz. I am about to try a NiCad AA size 1100MHA, weighing 0.8oz. It gives just as good glow as the Sub C. Hopefully for nearly as long. A NIMH battery2400MAH is also being tested.

The joiners are not essential but they allow the battery to be removed if you wish. I use tagged batteries and solder the wire to the tags for minimum power loss. The battery is mounted reasonably close to the C.G.

The small slide switch can be bought from Jacar Electronics.





Modelling Memories – John Corby

My earliest memories of a lifetime fascination with flight began around the age of 8 with small Japanese wire and silk rubber models which were in shops around the late thirties, and models which were often on display in a window on the steps of Hurstville railway station. Building numerous kit models followed but without any guidance progress was negligible until contact with modellers in the St George Model Flying Club resulted in many happy hours of control-line flying and more encouraging free flight results

Bankstown Nationals in 1948 was a revelation and models improved steadily with a Cavu/Mills Mk1being the first fly-away, from Bass Hill.

and models including Pinocchio, Raff V and Evans Jaguar leading to own design Wakefield's around 1950. One of my earliest Wakefield's had a spectacular climb of 65 seconds but was consistently down in 2.10 So much for my freewheeling prop. design! Early morning flying was done at Barton Park, Rockdale and even the Lakes golf course at Mascot, all with model in arm and on my bicycle!

My earliest Aero modellers date back to 1949 and the magazine was a great help to improving performance. In '51 and'52 the Anthony Horden's Wakefield comps were won as was the A2 state champs at Schofield so I had finally reached a decent performance level at age 20

From this time on modelling activities slowed as contact with a young girl just turning 16 grew into what has been a wonderful lifetime partnership. Around this time also, interest was growing in Australia in amateur aircraft building activities and my increasing involvement led to the eventual design and co-building of the Corby Starlet prototype —In all a 12 year project from design start to final certification. I am very pleased that the Starlet as an Australian design has been successful internationally and is still being built and flown by enthusiasts around the world.

So, for many years modelling had to take its place with family, my professional aviation career and amateur building activities. Never stopped modelling but always with competing priorities, probably a common story,

The best decision I have made in recent times is that since I enjoy modelling more than any other pastime I will set aside at least one day a week to fly and in this I have been most fortunate to be able to join with some world class modellers in our Friday gettogethers at Windsor.

Rubber models flying extremely well, power models still challenging, but the company is always great, (though not always complimentary)

Naturally, submissions will be welcomed earlier than this date.

Nominations for MAAA Executive Positions

Under Rule 29, nominations are called for the position of MAAA Treasurer and Vice President.

Nominees must provide:

- A written nomination for the position sought, signed by two Affiliate Members of the Association
- Written consent (which may be endorsed on the nomination)
- Curriculum vitae

This information must be received by the Federal Secretary no later than **Monday 28 February 2011.** Please note that the term of office is three years.

Frequently Asked Questions

A recent addition to the MAAA website at www.maaa.asn.au is a Frequently Asked Questions page. The page is broken up into two sections at this stage, one for general questions and the second relating to questions and answers regarding 2.4GHz equipment. The intention of this page is to provide members and prospective members with easy access to typical, everyday information, which may or may not be contained within the MOPs.

Concessional Membership

From 1 January 2011, a person who has not been an MAAA member the previous membership year is entitled to half MAAA fees. Current MAAA Rules require that any person who was a member in 2009-2010 shall still pay the full fee. Clubs should note that Concessional Membership is only available to new members and those who have not been affiliated since 1July 2009.

Outcomes from Reported Incidents

In a recent incident which resulted in damage to a vehicle and destruction of the model on impact, investigations established a strong link to a faulty on/off switch on the model. Whilst the exact reason for the model being uncontrolled from the point of take off was not able to be determined, modellers are reminded that switches on models are one of the less reliable components in a radio system and should be checked or replaced regularly.

64th MAAA Nationals Dalby Queensland

Bulletin number four has been posted on the MAAA website with updates. Organisers of the Nationals are endeavouring to get as many entries for the events as possible with entries being accepted up to the day of competition with no late entry fee being imposed.

The Nationals Chairman has indicated that everything is on track for a successful and friendly Nationals and they have done everything possible to promote the events to all sections of the modelling community via an extensive advertising campaign throughout Australia. Entries are still coming in for a lot of events and some have record entries. (www.maaa.asn.au).

MAAA Membership System

The current membership system used by MAAA, State Associations and some clubs, is past its use-by date as far as underlying support programs and the ability for the MAAA to increase our requirements within the system. These problems have been apparent for several years and while an electronic patch was provided to enable the system to run beyond 2009 there is a need for the system to be replaced.

Over the last eighteen months MAAA has been investigating moving to a web based membership system. One possible problem which needs to be addressed and cleaned up to the best of our ability is the date of birth of members. It has never been a big issue in the past and this is why member/s have still been renewed if a date of birth was not provided. The State Registrars normally put in a DOB of 1/1/1901, as they still need to put a DOB in the current system for it to work. When we move to a new web based system, all the current data will be electronically transferred and questions are raised as to how the new system would analyse a large number of members with an age of 110 plus (with the same birthday)!

So that our data is able to be successfully and smoothly transferred, we are attempting to encourage members to update their details, hence the request for DOBs. We are not asking to see birth certificates but it seems questionable to enter a fictitious DOB for a member when there is the opportunity to have the correct data. Members are asked to consider this when they next renew.

F3C (Helicopter) 2011 World Championship Team Trial

With the release of Bulletin#4 of the 64th Nationals the F3C event and team trial did not gain sufficient entries and has been dropped from the 64th Nationals calendar. The Subcommittee Chairman will be contacted for further advice.

F3D (Pylon) 2011 World Championship Final Team Trial

The 2011 F3D Pylon World Championships are being run in Australia from the 12 to 14 August. AMPRA will be hosting the final team trial for the 2011 F3D Pylon event at the 64th Nationals in Queensland from Thursday 30 December 2010 to Saturday 1 January 2011.

In addition to the competitors, the Organising Committee for the 2011 F3D World Championships would like to hear from as many members or interested people who wish to be part of this event in the capacity of a helper. F3A (Aerobatic) 2011 World Championship Team Trial

A Team Trial will be run in accordance with the current F3A rules at the Australian Masters at the Valley Radio Flyers field Shepparton Vic on the weekend of Saturday, Sunday and Monday 12-14 of March 2011. F3A World Championships are to be held in the USA – Muncie, 23 – 31 July 2011.

2012 F2 Control Line World Championships Team Trials

Multi team trials for F2A, C and D will be held in five States from March 2011 to October 2011. A single team trial for F2B will also be held at a time and venue TBA but within the MOP time frames.
