## Editorial January 2022 and Nationals Report

After a long wait and three postponements they are finally over. Yes, we did hold the 1<sup>st</sup> West Wyalong National Championships on the Adrian Bryant field from the 28 December 2021 to 4 January 2022. Unfortunately, attendance was down for several reasons, but we managed to get it done. There were representatives from all disciplines, and all competed in the spirit of a national championship.

During the competition I managed to visit most venues and see many of the flyers competing. The most notable was F2A (Speed) There were six entries, and the competition was quite fierce. In one heat Andrew Heath managed to equal the Australian speed record and, in another, break the 300 kmph barrier smashing the record. It was a spine-chilling flight, and I did not realise the difference between 290kmph and 300kmph until I witnessed it. The sound of an engine at 41.5 thousand rpm is truly a sound to remember.

This new record was achieved on our new fully asphalted circle with a steel cyclone wire safety fence installed at a working bee only weeks before the competition. The circle should now be christened 'The Fastest Circle in Australia'.

I did not manage to get to McAllister oval during the aerobatics competition, but our judges reported to the house daily. Numbers were again down, and catering was not available due to the time of year and lesser numbers.

Bob Phippen, his sister Marianne and Eric Nutter managed the control line grass circle. I timed for some of the vintage combat bouts and became excited by the cut and thrust of the flyers attacking each other in the air. Carnage was high with line tangles and some unusual tactics in the centre. Apparently shouted encouragement and instructions are provided free of charge. I was once a gun at this but that was 60 years ago; reaction time now below ground level

Peter Scott was the contest director for SAMs. I eventually got to the SAMs field and saw some action even though the rules had to be explained to me. The flyers are keen and the models huge but there is no shortage of enthusiasm in competition, building and flying. The field turned out to be super good and these huge models with big wheels could just about manage anything. It was interesting to note that even SAMs flyers can lose models.

Everybody helped with free flight, but of note were Mike and Yvonne Pettigrew, Col Collyer, and Di Hannah. Everybody pitched in on the outdoor field often with more than one event in progress. Len Surtees enthusiasm with hand launch and catapult glider drove most of us spare but it was good to see his ability challenged by others. The field had been part slashed so that cars could drive over the field on temporary roads rather than drive through high grass and thistle. There were several changes of flying site to comply with wind changes but the weather during the competition was quite good. Wind speeds were about 3-5 metres per second most of the time and only on one occasion did we have to delay the event a few hours.

Camping sites were selected on arrival by campers and the facilities were praised. More than once did I hear; 'we have power, and we have showers.' Separate bathroom facilities were available for ladies and gents. Cooking and refrigeration facilities were available in the camp kitchen and once the mossies were evicted the area was quite comfortable. The camaraderie in the caravan/camping site was excellent and the site was left clean and tidy. Thanks campers.

Despite some withdrawals and failures to attend, the championships went off in a successful national fashion. Competitors were cooperative, helpful, and keen to use the facility again.

I would like to thank all those involved in the organisation and attendance at these championships. The offer to hold more contests for members of different disciplines at this venue is still open.




## 1st West Wyalong National's

# Remembering Dave Hegarty MAAA 72 1932-2021

I think, in total, I knew Dave for over fifty-seven years, and in that time, I believe there were three different Dave's

I first met Dave at the Doonside club in 1954, I would have been just 12 years old and Dave would have been 22, a very grown-up man to a 12-year-old boy, so for a few years I didn't have a lot to do with him. We became very good friends in the 1960s and he was my mentor for many years. He taught me the art of towing a glider, how to throw a chuck glider (which I must say he was very good at). He also taught me the finer arts of flying a scramble model. This involved how to set the model up, where to get yourself on the line for the best advantage along with a few other little tricks. I must have paid attention to this as I did very well flying scrambles at National's, thanks to Dave. Dave with his wife Peggy went to most flying competitions, Dave competing while Peggy was collating scores. We became really good friends in the late 60s. They would come up to the central coast as Dave would like to go spearfishing with me. On one occasion when Dave jumped out of the boat, he caught his ring finger on a bolt. This was just above the wedding ring he always wore. The finger swelled to such a size that the ring had to come off. Naturally being the nice guy I am, I volunteered to cut it off. Dave was very disturbed about this but I assured him that the jeweler could stick it back together so he agreed, or maybe it was the pain the finger was producing. Out with the razor saw and in no time, he had a split ring and a small amount of gold dust. The end result was a repaired ring and he still had his five fingers.

Dave lost Peggy in 1987 from a long and very rare illness, this changed Dave dramatically. Dave would carry a chip on his shoulder the size of a sheet of pine board for years. He became a different Dave. At this time, we were running diving / camping trips to the Barrier Reef and we talked Dave into joining us. These trips were back to roughing it and Dave was in his element, camping, cooking, fishing, and away from the worries of home. Home at this time didn't seem to be a happy place for him and he was keen to get away. Dave loved to cook and he knew we had a leg of lamb still in the fridge and he wanted to cook it right or wrong, he carried on about it so much that we arranged for it to be cooked and it was a surprise for him when it was served up to him in total. Dave was also very good on the tooth and from memory he did a real good job of getting through it. These trips were in the late 1980s and ran to the end of the 90s, by now we were becoming tired of the work running them and finally stopped the trips, and sadly Dave seemed to drop out of our lives.

This was also the time that Dave found out that he had an Aboriginal heritage so once again we had a different Dave. Dave now had a different purpose in life and became infatuated with finding out all he could about his ancestors. He did carry on building models but somehow it was a different Dave. One of his favorite models was the ABC Robin and I have promised myself to build one in memory of Dave. With his eye sight failing he started building control line models. With these he said he could see them; as they were at the end of the lines, also he couldn't lose them.

I found it sad, that we had to some extent drifted apart after so many happy years, but I guess living where he had moved to, gave him a different set of interests and one could say he had gone bush.

Dave, it's been a pleasure and an honor to have known you.
