Editorial July 2011

It has been a fabulous month! The scale weekend and Trans Tasman comp 2/3 July saw one of the busiest days on the paddock since the nationals many years ago. We had visitors from all over the place, New Zealand, South Australia, Victoria and even some locals. There was some concern that the NZs would not be able to make the comp with the dust cloud in the skies over the Tasman, but their scale entourage arrived in force. We managed to beat the kiwi's but not by much.

Our AGM will be held on 16 Sep 2011 and nominations need to be forwarded to the registrar three weeks prior to the meeting.

The next Australian Nationals will be held in Western Australia. The RC and CL competitions will be held mostly at Whiteman Park and the nearby surrounds. Free flight as usual will be held in the great outdoors north of Perth near Meckering. The nationals will be held after the SCC and AFFS and the dates are 12-19 Apr 2012. It should be noted that the AWA is in the process of making a bid to host the next world control line champs. The AWA is probably the most progressive and successful association in Australia

The contest calendar for 2012 is in the preparation stage as we speak and copies are being circulated for comment. A copy of the calendar is enclosed for comment.

The scramble at Richmond in May was won by Ray Woods from Illawarra. He regularly comes to Richmond and is now the NSW state scramble champ. In the last 5 years I cannot remember a scramble comp that he has not won at Richmond. Tahn and I attended the Illawarra Russell Forth Memorial Trophy Scramble recently and managed first and third respectively. Don't get mad get even.

The MAAA conference in Canberra went reasonably well and the proposal for a "National Centre for Model Aviation" given by Tahn was very favourably received. The NSWFFS was given approval to do a scoping study to determine the location, size and format of the centre. A copy of the presentation is available on request

Additional support for modellers proceeding overseas to attend world championships was also moved and an additional \$500 was approved for entry fees.

Last year at the 2010 conference, a request was made to financially support the visit of two overseas modellers. I have mentioned this before but while at the world champs in Argentina Igor Vivchar (F1B) and Aleksandrov Viavheslav (F1C and F1J) were approached and a set of conditions was proposed and accepted. This includes special training before and during the SCC and AFFS. More details will follow when known.

NSW Free Flight Society Inc F4A Trans Tasman Challenge and Free Flight Scale Rally2nd - 3rd July 2011.

The weather predictions were not encouraging and the Chilean volcanic ash cloud threatened to prevent our New Zealand competitors from crossing the Tasman, however what eventuated was perhaps the best Free Flight Scale event ever held at Richmond.

Thirty two Free Flight scale models made the field over the weekend and the considerable crowd of spectators and flyers alike were treated to a bonanza of free flight scale action. Antony Koerbin's BE 2e emerged as a deserving winner completing several realistic flights including an elusive take-off. Phil Mitchell, taking a break from his F1A schedule and Triathlons, campaigned his venerable Mills 1.3 powered Tiger Moth. The slow speed and steady flying characteristics including a smooth takeoff scoring highly. Maris Dislers accompanied by David Malpas, made the long trek from South Australia. Maris's CO2 powered Eastbourne monoplane and Davids' Morane Saulnier were sheer magic .

While all this was taking place Peter Jackson flew another sortie with the Albatross or was it the SE 5a and George Fay buzzed the crowd with his Douglas Dauntless or Curtis P 37 . The action just kept coming, with Eric Holland (Fieseler Storch & Bird Dog))and Stan Hinds (Focke-Wulf Stosser and Auster) making repeated flights out across the green turf, up into the clear blue.

Flight judges Terry Isted and Reg Towell were kept busy with a constant stream of attempts coming from all points of the compass in the almost dead calm conditions.

Stan Maugher and Ricky Bould were both having problems with the Monocoupe and Auster respectively with Stan earning the Spectacular Arrival award, and Ricky resorting to his CO2 black Piper Cub.. Tyro Walter Bolliger had his own stability problems with his Piper Cub and Robert Craine battled with his reluctant Avro Baby.



Manual of Procedures

The Manual of Procedures is a "live" document and is continually being updated. Please check the MAAA web site from time to time to ensure that you are aware of the latest editions of the documents. The MAAA has recently released the following amended documents in the Manual of Procedures:

MOP018 – Amended to clarify procedures when operating under 'spotlight' or 'stadium lighting' conditions, resulting from discussions held by the MAAA President and the AMA.

MOP034 & MOP 043 – In 2010 Council proposed that the MAAA Executive, based on the mind map drafted by the MAAA President and with advice from other members who could assist, formulate an Emergency Procedure. As a result of this, MOP034 <u>Emergency Procedure</u> has been developed for distribution to <u>State</u> <u>Associations only</u>. MOP043 <u>Emergency Policy</u> has also been produced for publication on the MAAA Website.

MOP066 – Guidance paragraph added alerting the user to possible interference between the technology used in FPV systems and the basic radio system controlling the model. This also resulted from discussions by the MAAA President and the AMA. MAAA033 – Form amended to remove a symbol which inadvertently required a radio range check prior to each flight.

MOP058 will shortly have additional guidance. The MAAA continue to hear of problems with 2.4 GHZ installations. There is already some guidance provided, but in addition we will emphasise even more clearly the importance of the location of all the antennas. Wire receiver antenna should be placed at 90 degrees to each other as is usually recommended by the manufacturers. In addition they should be located if at all possible so that at least one antenna has a clear view towards the transmitter whatever the flight attitude and that particularly metal components, such as the engine, do not get in the way. This is particularly important when the aircraft is on landing approach as it is both low to the ground and heading towards you. This is

also a critical situation for the transmitter antenna and one that can catch those who lay their antenna flat to avoid pointing it at the model when it is up in the air. This can be disastrous whilst landing, as either the top or bottom of the antenna can easily be pointing straight at the model. The result may be no control and a crash.

2011 MAAA Council Conference Elections

The 2011 MAAA Council Conference was held in Canberra from 21-22 May with elections for Vice President and Treasurer taking place. Paul Winter was returned as MAAA Vice President and Brian Dowie was elected to the position of MAAA Treasurer following the retirement of Garry Anderson. Congratulations to both the elected members. Following the elections the Chairman, Mike Close, expressed thanks and appreciation on behalf of MAAA to Garry Anderson for his work over the years as MAAA Treasurer. Council wished Garry a happy retirement, in Garry's words, as a 'grey nomad'.

MAAA Treasurer - Brian Dowie

Brian has outlined his experience for this newsletter.

At the last MAAA Council Conference I was elected Treasurer and have been requested to introduce myself to the Association.

I live in the Eastern Suburbs of Melbourne, Victoria and have been active in Model Aviation since 1988. My interests are in Old Timers and I also have an appreciation of Scale Models. My skills do not match my enthusiasm. I have been involved at Committee level with Peninsula Radio Control Society since 1993 and with the VMAA since 2001. I am also a member of Pakenham and District Aircraft Radio Control Society.

I am a qualified Accountant and have been self employed since 1980.

2011 - 2012 MAAA Membership Fees

The MAAA Insurance has been put in place for the 2011/12 period through Willis Australia. While there was a small increase in the overall cost of Insurance for the next period the MAAA fees for the coming year remain the same. There is, however, one change. For many years now the MAAA Senior and Pensioner Fees have been the same. It was decided by Council that the Pensioner category would no longer exist and in future would be just Seniors. Clubs and States can continue with their own classes of members if they wish, but the MAAA membership card will show them all as Seniors.

MAAA fees are as follows: Seniors - \$60.00 and Juniors - \$30.00. State Association and Club fees are in addition to the MAAA fee.

MAAA Park Flyers

Aeromodellers of Western Australia (AWA) presented a submission to the 2011 Council Conference to introduce Park Flyer membership into MAAA. This submission outlined in detail the reasoning for such a membership scheme, along with its implementation and policing, based on investigations with Local Government

Councils in Perth. The key to success lies with those Local Government Councils who are willing to make some of their recreational space available for Park Flyers, and then police the activity.

The MAAA Council agreed to allow a trial introduction of Park Flyer membership in Western Australia only, to be reviewed at the 2012 MAAA Council Conference. The details are still to be finalised but it is likely to have significant weight and power restrictions and a separate insurance policy providing only minimum essential Public Liability cover.
