EDITORIAL JANUARY 2023

HI Team,

I am currently in Queensland and will also not be available for the next meeting, Aaron our VP hopefully take the chair. I also hope that Aaron has been able to get sufficient information from our MAAA Safety Member so he can discuss the ACVRM (This is the new method of height clearance applications). Our application at WW is due in October this year and we do not want to be late.

From 16-19 March I will be participating in the Kosi Challenge; it involves walking up Mt Kosciusko in aid of Rare Cancers Australia. I have by virtue of being married to Karen been doomed as a helper.

This 73rd combined national championships will be held from 28 December 2023 to 4 Jan 2024. A draft program has already been published and I hope it becomes firm (there always seems to be changes). An application will be forwarded to the MAAA for financial support when I have completed a budget. This needs to be ready before 21 March.

The conduct of nationals championships is really a hot potato with most specific RC groups, they would prefer to hold their own and not have a combined effort. I agree with them because we cannot provide suitable flying surfaces and the conditions that they require. This nationals is a combined nationals and includes free flight and control line. It is also a world team qualifying event for both disciplines. SAMs will also participate but no qualifying is required.

I attended a CLAS meeting a couple of weeks ago and discussed the Nats proposal and asked for assistance in badge design to include CL and a registrar. We, the NSWFFS will provide the field and appropriate amenities for the conduct of the competition. The old badge for the last national champs was happily accepted and Paul Turner put up his hand to be the registrar. Gary Pope offered his assistance to help with a spreadsheet. The Member Jungle may be able to determine entry membership, but we will wait until it is launched. It to determine entry membership but we will wait until it is launched. It was agreed that this national championship will be called the 73rd Combined Nationals Championships. The NSWFFS will complete the business plan, budget and risk assessments.

We have an offer of sponsorship from Bill East Model Productions who will provide laser cut kits for certain events. His quality is excellent. We will continue to search for more sponsorship.

Upcoming events include the AFFS championships from 16-23 April. Bear in mind that the first half is in Naranderra and the second half in West Wyalong. Our State champs and the Victorian State champs will be held 3-5 June at West Wyalong. Don't forget the big scale weekend 30 Jun to 2 July. The mini max-out will be held late July at West Wyalong.

The next MAAA council conference will be held on 19-21 May. It should be noted that the current term for the Vice Presidents position has expired and there are two nominations; Michael Hobson and Reeve Marsh.

That's about all folks, just check your calendar and keep on flying.

Howard Field MAAA 5212

I had a house full of visitors yesterday and we got around to talking about R/C flying when we first took it up . Somebody brought up a story which I now remember Lyle Winley relating about Howard . He actually pioneered night flying of R/C models . He was approached by the CSIRO asking if it was feasible to take air samples at altitude at night in western Sydney . He duly fitted up one of his models with the necessary filter screens and three light bulbs one on each wing tip and one on the tail . These lights were attached to short lengths of piano wire placing them about 2 inches away from the aircraft . He also had an independent battery pack for each light because he was paranoid about losing all of the lights due to a broken wire . He also fitted a large fuel tank giving him 30 minute flights to conform to a CSIRO requirement . Apparently the whole system was quite successful and confirmed that the air quality in western Sydney was as bad as they had suspected . It was not being scavenged by the sea breezes or by the westerly winds either. Howard once told Lyle that he preferred to fly on moon free nights because the small lights did not show up very well in moon light. As far as I can remember this all took place in the early 1960s . A bit of a report for the HVC. As some of you know, I've been flying a little more control line of late. I decided to have a go at slow combat at this years Hunter Valley Champs. I had a model from Graeme Burgess which I fitted an OS 15 to several weeks ago and was putting in some good practice, and getting more comfortable with. My backup model was my David Owen designed Magnum that was built for Oily Hand a few years ago.

On to the HVC, I think 12 entries this year. My first bout was with Robert Owen. With the adrenaline pumping I gave it everything, Robert got a cut on me fairly early on and was in front. After an engine cut



out I was back in the air with 30sec to go, with some evasive maneuvering I managed to get 2 cuts on Robert which gave me my first win. 3 wins and 1 loss later there it was down to 3 left. I had to use my backup model for my last bout against Steve Bakac. Not sure from the outside, but from the inside it felt action packed that Steve won on time alone as none of us managed a cut. The last bout saw Robert DQ'd which pushed me up to 2nd place.

So, after 5 bouts, 2 broken models and a 2nd place, I was feeling pretty good as I hadn't flown combat before. Now to build some models for the next one!!

On to Sunday morning. HLG, CLG and TLG were split into 3 separate events. Natalie was out early practicing with here Sting MK2 15 which she had built showing us how it should be done. I also used a Sting MK2 15 for CLG. I had a new TLG for this year, now up to 34" span and refined a little from last years model was flying really well and managed some 50 odd seconds flights in the early morning still conditions. SUMMER COUPE D'HIVER COMPETITION NOTICE

This competition is open to free flighters affiliated with the MAAA.

The VFFS decided to try 'inhouse' postal competitions as a way to make the best of the unpredictable free flight weather we experience and the difficulty of getting all hands out when a nice day comes along.

We have chosen 60s Coupes for the trial because:

- A number of us enjoyed flying them in Mark Braunlich's Hip Pocket Aeronautics Postal and there are a lot of interesting designs available via the work that has been done by Mark and flyers commentating on his postal competition on Hip Pocket Aeronautics.
- A two-minute maximum class can more easily be flown on available fields.
- A number of flyers already have suitable models.

We are essentially using the Rules formulated by Mark which are based on the FAI F1G rules (which can be downloaded at https://www.fai.org/ciam-documents) with additions to ensure 1960 to 1970 designs and materials.

Flights for this competition must be made at a location in Australia between 1st Jan 2023 to 31st March inclusive. A competitor may make official flights on more than one day during the allotted time span.

1960s Summer Cup Postal Rules:

Models must be built from plans or 3-views published between January, 1960 and December, 1969 (inclusive). Earlier models that were published in the 1960s may be flown. Models designed in the 1960s that were not published until later may not be flown in this competition.

Technology and materials. Models must not be "modernized" with materials that were not in common use in that decade. For example, covering should be tissue paper, Silkspan or Modelspan. Models must not include VIT, folding wings, or other functions and materials common in modern F1G practice. (No carbon fibre, kevlar, mylar)

Models originally designed for 90gram airframes with 10gram motors may be lightened to 70g airframes for this competition.

Models must weigh in excess of 70g less motor. Motors must weigh less than 10g. Competitors are required to ensure their models and motors meet the weight requirement.

The competition will comprise five flights with a maximum of 120 seconds for each flight. In the case of an unsuccessful attempt a second attempt will be allowed. A second unsuccessful attempt will be recorded as a zero score

The timekeeper shall record the duration of the first attempt of the official flight unless the flight is unsuccessful.

If (5) five maximums are recorded by a competitor, additional flight(s) may be flown with maximum flight duration increasing in 30 second increments, 150, 180, 210, 240 seconds, etc.

The time sheet/scorecard must include the date and location of each flight together with the recorded time. The competitor and timekeeper must sign their time-sheet and email a scanned image to the VFFS secretary at helical@netspace.net.au by 14th of April 2023.

The top placing competitor will win a valuable item of aero-modelling kit provided by the VFFS.
