

Narrandera Flying Site Information

Narrandera, is a classic small country town located in the central Riverina region of south-western New South Wales, Australia. The town lies on the junction of the Newell and Sturt highways, adjacent to the Murrumbidgee River, with a population of around 3700 people.

It is 540 km South West of Sydney, and 430 km North of Melbourne. The surrounding country is flat, with few trees and fences. For April the average temperature in Celcius at 9am is 16.0 and 3pm is 22.0.

To get to Narrandera from Sydney or Melbourne it is usually done by car.

From Sydney:

Driving: Take the M31 and Sturt Highway (approx. 540 km, 6+ hours).

From Melbourne:

Driving: Drive north via the Hume Freeway and Newell Highway (approx. 430 km, 4h 55m).

Most of the flyers stay at the Newell Motor Inn and Narrandera Caravan Park on the southern side of the main town. There are around 6 or 7 other motels in the main town centre area.

The flying area used for the Australian Free Flight championships and the Southern Cross Cup is about 43 km south of the City

The small town of Morundah is along the way with a public bar which also sells food.
